



- Stains DO NOT have to be treated immediately take your time. Amodex will remove stains that have been there for weeks provided nothing has been applied.
- When used as your FIRST line of defense, Amodex works best on fresh or untreated stains.
- As a soap formula, Amodex MUST be rubbed in well, and rinsed.
- Amodex is great for "ring around the collar" and safe for spot treating. Just apply, rub in, and leave on the fabric until ready to launder.
- Using alcohol, hair spray, acetone, etc. sets ink, so don't use them on stains.

### **SPECIAL APPLICATIONS**

POROUS SURFACES (plastic, walls, etc) absorb stains. • Coat the area with **amodex**<sup>®</sup> and leave

BERRY STAINS: amodex<sup>®</sup> turns berry/wine stains blue - this is a normal phase of stain removal Apply amodex<sup>®</sup> and continue rubbing until light

STUBBORN/PRETREATED STAINS may be
